BUILDING DEPARTMENT RESIDENTIAL PERMIT INSTRUCTIONS *<u>*IMPORTANT PLEASE READ**</u> Permits are issued Monday - Friday from 8am - 3:30pm

Please use the SDL Portal on the township website to check the status of your application.


- First--You need to know your Permit #_____Address:_____Address:_____Address:_____Address:_____
- □ Hang the Permit Notice in a front window so it can be seen from the street until the job is complete.
- **Q** Review your permit for any notes written by the Subcodes officials, especially on the technical cards.
- □ Follow the Inspection Checklist if provided. An Inspection Checklist is not provided for minor work such as replacement of furnace, a/c and water heater, as only a final inspection is required.
- **U** You need to pass all your rough inspections before you can schedule your Building frame inspection.
- If you update or revise your project, you need to submit the appropriate Subcode Technical Section with two sets of documents. Architectural/Engineered drawings (if needed) must be signed with a raised seal. Permit number and/or Control number should be written on the Technical Section in the upper right corner. Forms/handouts and tutorials are on the Building tab on the township website.
- □ It is the property owner's responsibility to schedule final inspections. Schedule by calling 908-369-4313, extension 7164, 7165 or 7166. When calling, have your permit number available.
- All permit paperwork (signed permit, technical sections, specs, etc) must be onsite for all inspections or the inspection <u>cannot</u> be performed.
- When your project is complete and you have passed all final inspections:
 File all the paperwork, including Inspection stickers in a safe place. If you sell the property, this paperwork should be given to new owners.

If you received your permit in the mail, the permit fee has been paid. Make sure to schedule all required inspections.

If your project requires a Certificate of Occupancy, you will need to complete an application for Certificate of Occupancy after all final inspections are approved. See the Building Department for the application.
