

Residents are reminded to check their Swift911 settings to ensure they are receiving up to date information. Messages range from updates on upcoming events to emergency notifications and closures.

Log in and check your settings or create an account if you don't already have one.

Go to the <u>Swift 911 Portal</u>. If you do not already have an account, c lick the "Register Now" button at the top of the page and complete all of the required information. Upon completion of the registration, you will receive an email with a confirmation code from SwiftReach Networks link to confirm your profile.

If you already have an account, you can select or deselect how you receive notifications (phone calls, emails, text messages) right from the log in screen or you can log in to subscribe and unsubscribe from various lists.

Engineering Falcon Road Update	The Engineering Department would like to inform the public about the condition of Falcon Road. The eastbound lane of Falcon Road is deteriorated and our Department of Public Works has been patching the roadway almost daily, but with 260 miles of roads within the Township this is a monumental task.		
	The developers of the Gateway Development are responsible to rebuild this roadway which will include widening, drainage improvements, curbing and sidewalk on one side.		
	The hold-up is that there are two (2) property owners along Falcon Road still negotiating with the developer on the cost of the additional land acquisition for the road widening and the road continues to deteriorate. Since this land acquisition does take time and sometimes court action is necessary, it appears we are still months to a year away.		
	The Township Administration and Staff have recently met with the developer and the developer has committed to do temporary paving repairs on the eastbound lane within the next few weeks, weather permitting. This temporary paving will be more than just patching as our Department of Public Works is doing constantly, so the driving surface should be better until the road is fully rebuilt.		
	Please understand what is involved and on behalf of the Township Committee, we are working on the condition of Falcon Road.		
Health Department Septic System Maintenance	Spring really is just around the corner! When making your spring cleaning list, don't forget your septic system maintenance. The Hillsborough Health Department would like to remind all homeowners with onsite wastewater treatment systems (septic systems) to make sure they maintain their system. Maintaining a septic system is important to keeping it working for many years to come. The septic system consists of a tank and a disposal field. Solids settle out in the tank, and the dirty water from the tank is treated by bacteria in the disposal field. If the tank isn't pumped out at least every 3 years, the solids		
	will enter the disposal field and clog and destroy it, costing thousands of dollars. In addition to making sure your tank is pumped regularly, you should also do the following:		
	 Don't dispose of hazardous household waste in the sinks or toilets. Don't drive over or park on the disposal field. Don't use too much water at once - practice water conservation, try not to use laundry and dishwasher at the same time. Plant only grass over and around your disposal field. Don't add commercial septic tank additives to speed up decomposition Don't construct anything that will encroach upon any part of the septic system; contact the health department for setback requirements. 		

- System: Contact the nearth department for setback requirements.
 Don't put non-biodegradable substances into your system such as diapers, cat litter, cigarette filters, etc.
 Don't hook up sump pumps or floor drains to your septic system
 Don't empty hot tubs, jacuzzi, or water softener waste into the septic
- system.
- Fix all leaking faucets and toilets




New Jersey American Water to Start Annual Water Main Flushing

This spring and into the summer months, New Jersey American Water will perform its annual cleaning of the water distribution system to help ensure that customers continue to receive high-quality, reliable water service. Starting the week of March 20, New Jersey American Water will begin annual maintenance to flush out harmless mineral deposits that may have built up in the pipe's inner walls.

Flushing the water mains involves loosening sediment by pumping a high velocity of water into the pipes then out through open fire hydrants. According to the schedule posted at <u>www.newjerseyamwater.com</u>, under Alerts, **flushing in Hillsborough is scheduled to occur between** March 20th and April 6th.

Mindful parenting is about tuning in to how we feel so we can make a thoughtful choice about how to respond to our children, rather than mindlessly reacting to them.

- 4. Decreased Stress
- 5. Increase Productivity


