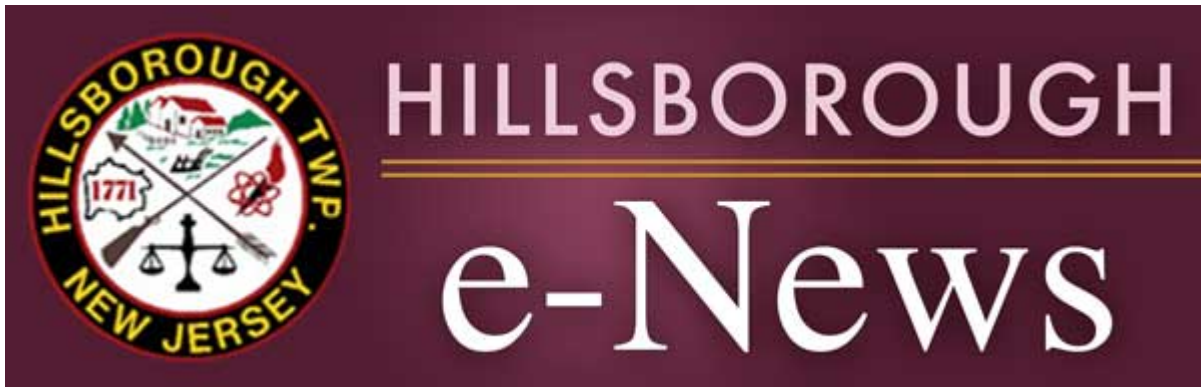

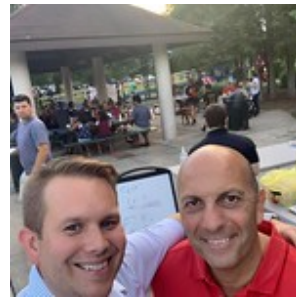

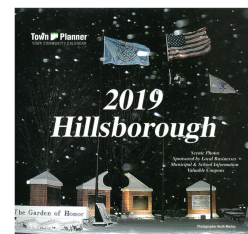
Ribbon Cutting for Thai Chili House

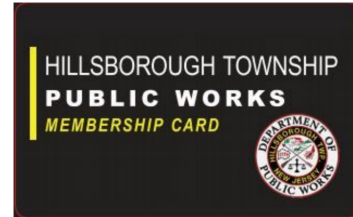

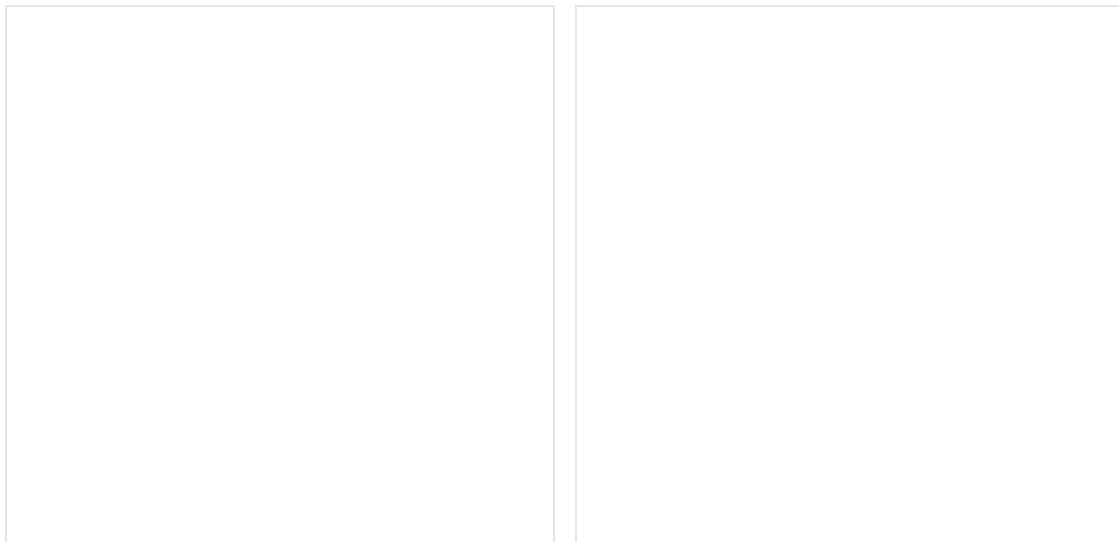

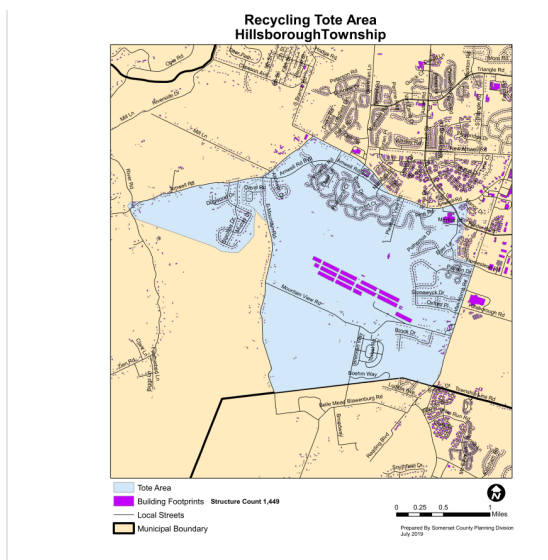
News You Can Use

Dual Stream Recycling Program Expanding to Include More Hillsborough Neighborhoods

The Somerset County Recycling Division is providing two 65-gallon wheeled recycling totes to residents. Each tote has a different color lid (yellow and lime green). Stickers on the lids indicate what materials are to be placed in the totes. Regular scheduled pickups with the new totes will begin on your next scheduled recycling date after delivery of totes. The tote with the lime green lid is for the cardboard and paper products, and the tote with the yellow lid is for commingled glass, cans, and plastic materials. Totes will be dropped off to residents in the area on August 27th.

Check the maps below to see if your neighborhood is included in this phase.





NEW DUAL STREAM PROGRAM

The Somerset County Recycling Division is providing two 65-gallon wheeled recycling totes to residents. Each tote has a different color lid (yellow and lime green). Stickers on the lids indicate what materials are to be placed in the totes.

Regular scheduled pickups with the new totes will begin on your next scheduled recycling date after delivery of totes.

The tote with the lime green lid is for the cardboard and paper products, and the tote with the yellow lid is for commingled glass, cans, and plastic materials.

Accepted items are as follows for the paper tote (lime green lid): Newspapers, inserts, junk mail, magazines, catalogs, envelopes, paperback books, corrugated cardboard, colored paper, clean pizza boxes, office and school papers, shredded papers, chipboard boxes including cereal, cookie, pasta, cake, crackers, detergent (remove plastic liners), gift, shoe, shirt and any retail boxes, paper egg cartons, paper bags, books (hard covers must be removed), phone books, non-metallic gift wrap and greeting cards.

Accepted items are as follows for the commingled tote (yellow lid): Aluminum, steel and bimetal cans, glass bottles (all colors), glass jars (all colors), plastic bottles and containers #1 - #7 (Examples: water, soda, milk, juice, soap, detergent, bleach, shampoo, and cleaning agent bottles). You may also include peanut butter, yogurt and diaper-wipe containers, margarine tubs, plastic trays and clear plastic clamshell containers from restaurant salad bars.

We will NOT take the following items:
Plastic bags, Styrofoam®, garbage cans, flower pots, or kitty litter containers.

Spring Reins of Life Seeks 8 Veterans for Equine Therapy Program

Spring Reins of Life is seeking 8 Veterans to participate in an 8 week EAGALA Equine Therapy program set to begin September 5th.

The program will be held Tuesday and Thursday from 6:00 pm-7:30 pm. Transportation is not provided. Attendance commitment for all the sessions is important as space for each group is so limited.

Dates: September 5th, 10th, 12th, 17th, 19th, 24th, 26th, and Oct 1st.

Spring Reins of Life has been an approved EAGALA Military Services Provider since in 2014. They are the 1st and currently only program in New Jersey!

Requirements of veteran participants:

- US Veteran (does not have to be combat)
- Diagnosis OR Symptoms of PTSD *(does not have to be medically diagnosed)
- Self-Transportation to the farm
- Commitment to Attend 8 sessions (space is limited to eight veterans)
- Anonymous pre and post assessment surveys

Operation Horse [Spring Reins of Life 501(c)3] is currently recruiting Veterans to participate in a group equine mental health intervention aimed at treating trauma and the impacts of military service. 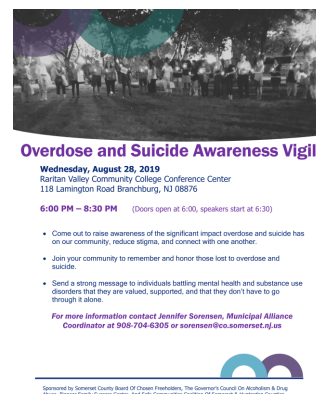
