

Mayor Frank DelCore reminded residents that various offices offer evening hours for limited services at the Township.

The Building Office remains open until 7 pm each Tuesday to pick up permit applications, accept permits, schedule inspections and other limited services. The Building Office will also be conducting inspections on Saturdays for homeowners only.

The Clerk's Office is open until 7 pm on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month when Township Committee Meetings are being held for notary services and voter registration.

Winter Storm Reminders

- In the event you experience a loss of power, please contact your power company directly and report the outage. Do not assume that the outage has already been reported. JCP&L: 888-544-4877 and PSE&G 800-436-7734.
- Do not touch or attempt to move downed lines.
- Do not operate generators inside your residence nor your garage; use only outdoors.
- If you are using candles, please ensure they are not placed by any flammable material and remain attended while lit. Please extinguish candles when leaving a room.
- If using space heaters, ensure they are placed in a safe location away from flammable materials and walls.
- 911 is for Emergency use only. Non emergencies, please call 908-369-4323.
- On street parking is prohibited during the storm.
- All residents are encouraged to remain at home, but if you need to venture out, please allow extra travel time to allow for safe arrival at your destination.
- Do not place trash cans or recycling cans out until the plows have passed. If you must put them
 out, place them well back from the curb line so the plows or projected snow does not hit
 them. Remove empty cans as soon as possible.

Reminder to All Residents: Parking Prohibited on Snow Covered Roads Clear Snow and Ice from Vehicles Before Operating

Committeewoman Gloria McCauley, Liaison to Public Safety would like to remind all residents, of the prohibition of parking on snow covered roads. "Township Code Chapter 143-21 prohibits parking on snow covered roads. When snow is anticipated, use off street parking as an alternative. Vehicles are subject to summonses and the potential of being towed at the owner's expense," reported Committeewoman McCauley.

Department Updates

Building Department

The Building Department is pleased to announce an amnesty program, which will run until January 31, 2019. This program will excuse residents and business owners from getting penalized for having open permits, having previous work done without permits, failing to obtain a Certificate of Occupancy and/or have an expired Temporary Certificate of Occupancy. If you visit the Building Department within this allotted time frame, we will assist you with gaining compliance for your projects. Permit fees will still be applicable but, again, you will not be penalized for noncompliance.

Business Advocate

A new year and a new opportunity for the Hillsborough Businesses to promote themselves. We encourage the Hillsborough Business Community visit the newly updated HBA website, www.hillsboroughbusiness.org, to update their business profiles on the Hillsborough Township Business Finder. A new feature for businesses include posting their events on HBA Calendar.

In other news, improvements are being made to the Shop Hillsborough Program. Fincredit the administrator of the program is upgrading the system by replacing terminals with android devices, which will allow merchants to scan a QR code.

Please visit <u>www.hillsboroughbusiness.org</u> for directions to download your cards QR code onto your smartphone or physically attach to your

card. Additionally, merchants will also be able to input your registered phone number or card ID. The new system is totally paperless, therefore a receipt will be sent to your registered email address. Remember, you can always check your balance in your account at www.propertytaxcard.com

Engineering

Did you know that there are 530 lane miles of roadways and 115 miles of sidewalks that are maintained by Hillsborough Township? To put that into perspective the amount of infrastructure is the same distance as a trip from NJ to South Carolina!

The Engineering Department works with the Public Works Department to identify roads that require repairs. To report a pothole please notify the Department of Public Works at 908-369-3950.

Finance Department

2019 dog license renewals have been mailed out. Renewals can be paid in person in the Finance Office, by mail, or by using the online system beginning January 7th. Your dog's rabies vaccine must be valid through October 2019 in order to renew. To avoid a late fee, renew your dog license by March 1st.

Health Department

Radon Kits

January is Radon Awareness Month - free Radon Test Kits are still available. The local health departments in Somerset County (Greater Somerset Public Health Partnership) have agreed to designate January as Radon Action Month. Radon is a colorless, odorless gas that can be emitted from naturally occurring rocks and soil that contain uranium and radon. The Hillsborough Health Department will continue to distribute free radon test



kits to Hillsborough Township residents on a first come, first served basis. Residents can call the Health Department at 908-369-5652 or stop in the Health Department between 8:30 am and 4:00 pm to get a kit. Please see further information on the health website.

Free Rabies Vaccination Clinic

Annual Free Rabies Vaccination Clinic to be held on Saturday, January 26th at the Hillsborough Township Department of Public Works Yard located at 21 East Mountain Road. No pre-registration is necessary. Dogs must be leashed and cats are required to be in a secure carrier.



Police

The Hillsborough Township police reminds residents, as we approach winter, that NJ law requires all snow and ice to be removed from vehicle's hood, windows and roof before driving. For your safety, drive slow & adjust your speed for the changing road conditions and increase your following distance from other vehicles. Give snowplows and sander vehicles plenty of room to work. Don't tailgate and try not to pass them as their field of vision is restricted - you may see them but they don't always see you!

Also just a reminder that Township Code Chapter 143-21 prohibits parking on snow covered roads. When snow is anticipated, use off street parking as an alternative. Vehicles are subject to summonses and the potential of being towed at the owner's expense.

Public Works

The Township Leaf Collection Program has concluded. The entire town received two passes at a minimum. Roughly ten thousand cubic yards of leaves were vacuumed throughout the town. Local farmers accepted the leaves to use as a soil amendment for their crops.

Public Works is actively engaged in filling potholes around the township. As a common practice the higher speed roads will receive the first attention for safety reasons.
