Sustainable Hillsborough

For the months of February and April 2020, Nikita Agarwal from Girl Scout Troop #60364, as part of her Gold Award project, partnered with Hillsborough Township to conduct the Hillsborough Compost Challenge 2020. A digital and in-person outreach and was initiated to spread awareness about the importance to compost.

This effort included a green challenge component where 360 Hillsborough households pledged, exceeding the 2.5% of the population requirement for Sustainable Jersey. This accounts for almost 1 ton of waste that would be removed from every 100 tons disposed.

Primary Election Update:

- June 16th is the last day to register to vote in the July Primary.
- The Primary will be held on July 7th and voting by mail (VBM) for the primary is encouraged.
- All registered Democratic voters will receive a Democratic Mail In Ballot, with pre-paid postage.
- All registered Republican voters will receive a Republican Mail In Ballot, with pre-paid postage.
- All registered unaffiliated and inactive voters will receive a Mail In Ballot Application, with pre-paid postage.
- To receive the ballot by mail, the application must be received by the *County Clerk* seven (7) days prior to the election. A voter may also return the application in person to the *County Clerk* until Election Day, but the voted ballot must be returned by 8 pm. The *County Clerk* cannot accept faxed or emailed copies of a Application for Vote by Mail Ballot, unless you are a Military or Overseas Voter, since an original signature is required.
- There will be drop boxes located in several locations throughout the County. All
 voted ballots must be in a drop box, returned to the Board of Elections or
 postmarked by 8 pm on Election Day.
- **IMPORTANT TO NOTE**: In person voting will be via provisional ballot only, unless the voter is visually impaired or otherwise certifies to a disability which requires an accessible voting machine.
- All other voters who visit a polling location will be required to vote on a provisional ballot.




Hillsborough Township Youth Services Commission Sponsors 5th Grade Running and Character Development Co-curricular Clubs

The Youth Services Commission sponsors two 5th grade running and character development co-curricular clubs. The Girls **iRUN** (I am Responsible, Unique, Nondrinker) and the Boys **BLUR** (Boys Learning United through Running) are programs serving over 100 students in the Fall and Spring each year. There are four dedicated facilitators who guide and mentor students in the clubs. Among the topics that the clubs discuss, in a safe environment, are self-respect, confidence building, handling poor procesure putrition, and substance abuse of



handling peer pressure, nutrition, and substance abuse prevention.

This Spring, the facilitators developed a virtual program that about 110 students will participate in and some of their parents will join as well. One of the highlighted events this year will be the Hillsborough YMCA's Hillsborough Hop Virtual 5K.

Update on the 2020 paving program

- Willow Road Phase 1 (between Amwell Road & Valinor Drive) Completed
- Andria Avenue Completed

Finance/Tax Collector:

 The Township will be issuing estimated 3rd quarter tax bills. The bills will be a small, single sheet and will be for the August payment only. The Shop Hillsborough credits will be applied to those bills as well. The Finance Department will be mailing the bills during the week of June 22nd.

Health:

- Reminder be sure your pets are currently vaccinated against rabies and dogs are licensed. The dog license application or renewal can be found on the Township website.
- On the <u>Township website main page</u> there is a recycling icon click there to learn more ways to recycle and reuse and ultimately consume less.
- The Health Department continues to receive guidance from the State regarding opening procedures for child care facilities, summer camp and coming soon will be pool guidance.

Police:

 Through the collaboration with the Police, Engineering Department and Administration a letter was sent to the NJDOT to revisit the cost sharing of the Raider Boulevard dedicated left-turn arrow. The result was the Township is now not responsible for 25% of the electrical costs associated with the revision of the existing traffic signal on Raider Boulevard (dedicated left arrow).

Public Works:

- Public Works Department is back in full swing with its Annual Clean Up Drop Off Program along with many other infrastructure repairs and maintenance items.
- Ditch maintenance completed this Spring to assure the proper flow of the water runoff from the more rural roadways.
- Plan to start the crack sealing program which helps prolong the life of the roadways by keeping damaging moisture out of the subsurface materials of the road.
- We urge everyone participating in any of our programs to read the new safety guidelines available on our website.
- Public Works Department would like to thanks to the Borough of Raritan for their donation of a Mack garbage truck that was headed for public auction. This will be utilized for our Senior Curbside Pickups and Clean Communities Townwide Clean Up days.


Jersey Central Power & Light will be conducting their Annual Vegetation Management Aerial Patrol. Vegetation Management Aerial inspections are scheduled during the April through September time frame on an annual basis and cover all transmission facilities system-wide. Patrols consist of a Forestry Specialist who accompanies the pilot to identify effectiveness of prior year's herbicide application and



identification of any conditions warranting further inspection from the ground and/or corrective action.

Please be advised that Haverfield will be the helicopter company assisting in the inspections on all JCP&L Transmission Lines, beginning June 15th through June 20th, weather permitting. The pilot will be in communication with any local airports when in their airspace. The helicopter will be flying at a speed of about 35-40 mph above or alongside the lines and may circle around for a closer inspection. The helicopter is a Black MD500 helicopter with red tail number N500LK.







Breakdown of Hillsborough Township Cases As Reported by Hillsborough Township Health Department




Positive Hillsborough Township Cases by Age Range

Please be advised that the numbers posted here and on the Township website reported those that are Hillsborough Township Health Department based on reports from the NJ Department Health surveillance of system. The reported numbers are only from those individuals who have been tested for COVID-19 and are confirmed positive through an FDA approved laboratory for COVID-19 testing purpose. It does not include those contacts of the positive individuals or any individuals, who are sick and have not been tested.







* Confirmed cases and confirmed deceased from Long Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities may not also be included in the total number of cases above.

The number of cases from the above section by age and deceased cannot be added to the Long Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities confirmed cases and confirmed deceased to get a total case count and a total deceased count. The reason for this is that there are different reporting mechanisms in place capturing that data. The NJ Department of Health surveillance system obtains reports from State run labs. The Long Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities utilize many different labs, State, out-of-state and private, therefore, their numbers are not completely reflected in the total Hillsborough numbers from the State system at this time. That withstanding, you cannot simply add the two sets of numbers either to get a total case count, as some of the LTC/ALF numbers are counted in the State system.

If you are a Hillsborough resident and have tested positive for Coronavirus / COVID-19, please contact the Health Department at 908-369-5652.

The Hillsborough Township Health Department continues to monitor all cases and is working with the State to identify any potential contacts for follow-up. A representative from the Hillsborough Township Health Department will reach out to all individuals determined to have been in close contact with the positive testing persons within 24-48 hours of each case being confirmed.
