Spotted Lanternfly (SLF) is an invasive insect that is spreading throughout New Jersey. SLF feeds on the plant sap of many different plants including grapevines, maples, black walnut, and other important plants in NJ. If you see SLF, help us stop it in its tracks! Township Senior Activity Room Opened Monday July 20th



After several months of the Peter J. Biondi Municipal Building being closed to the public amid the COVID-19 public health crisis, the building re-opened to the public on Monday, July 6th at 8 am, with several safety precautions in place. In the next phase of the Hillsborough Opening, the Senior Activity Room opened on Monday, July 20th to any Hillsborough residents over the age of 60.

There are several safety precautions in place to protect both visitors and employees. All visitors are required to wear a mask or other facial covering and must sign in at reception upon entry to the building. Visitors are reminded to practice social

distancing of at least 6 feet apart. Seniors entering the activity room will also be asked to sign in the log, in the activity room as was previously required. In compliance with Executive Order regulations, capacity is limited to no more than 30 individuals in the activity room at one time.

If you are experiencing any of the following symptoms or have experienced these symptoms in the last 72 hours, please do not enter this building nor the Senior Activity Room:

- Have a fever or feel feverish
- Cough (unrelated to allergies)
- Shortness of breath
- Unusual fatigue
- New loss of sense of taste or smell
- Worsening / consistent headaches
- Unusual muscle pain
- Sore throat (unrelated to allergies)
- Diarrhea

The hours of operation for the Peter J. Biondi Municipal Building will be Monday through Friday, 8 am to 4:30 pm until further notice.



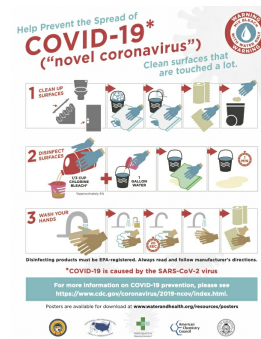
