- The Municipal Building will be closed to the public. Please refer to our Township <u>website</u> for self-services functions like on-line payments, forms and contact phone numbers for departments.
- All Hillsborough Township Parks will remain open however the playgrounds and courts of all kind, skate will be closed.
- Building Department has <u>modified its protocols</u> while the Municipal Complex is closed. In addition, they will not have extended hours until further notice.
- As of March 18th, Hillsborough Assessor's office has cancelled all upcoming inspection appointments and will call to reschedule once the health crisis is over.

Governor Murphy's Update Regarding All Indoor Retail Shopping Malls, Amusement Parks, and Amusement Centers Across New Jersey

T he Governor has directed the closure of all indoor retail shopping malls, amusement parks, and amusement centers across New Jersey until the current emergency ends. Restaurants which are located within malls, and which also have their own entrances separate from the general mall entrances, may remain open for takeout or delivery only.
