Leaf Collection Schedule: November 17th - 20th

There will be two crews in the Belle Mead section, two crews in the center of town, and two crews in the Mountain area.

- Crew in Wesley Road area, Lorien Place area, Dunedain Street area, Rivendell Road area, Lowe Avenue area, Lynn Court area
- Crew in Banor Park area, Stockton Road area, Crestmont Drive area, Wyckoff Way area, Perrine Pike areas



- Crew in Riverview Terrace area, Steeplechase area, Stagecoach Way area
- Crew in Walnut Grove area, Matthew Road area, Joshua Drive area, Scott Drive area
- Crew in White Meadow area, Willows Edge area, Fox Chase Area, and Valinor Road area
- Crew in Oxford Place area, Pierson Drive area, and Polhemus Drive area, and Woodfield Estates area
- Crew in Chamberlain Drive area, Orchard Drive area, Wagner Lane area, Deer Path area, and Flagtown area

This schedule is dependent on weather, manpower, equipment breakage, and any other unforeseen issues. If you don't see your street on this list, please be patient. A crew will be in your area as soon as possible.

You are also able to take leaves to the Auten Road Site every Saturday during the month of November between 7 am and 3 pm, and the first three Saturdays in December. Grass and leaves ONLY. The Auten Road Site does not accept brush or bulk items at these events. The Auten Road Site is also open the third Friday of each month between 11 am and 3 pm for grass and leaf Drop off ONLY.

The annual Clean Up Program concluded in October and will resume again in April, with tickets being available on Community Pass in February or March.

Holiday Safety Tips

Thanksgiving is right around the corner! The CDC recommends that all adults and children age 5 and older get a COVID-19 vaccine. To enjoy a happy and healthy Thanksgiving, remember to track local transmission rates, take precautions like wearing a mask and washing your hands, and get a booster shot if you are eligible.

Recipe for Thanksgiving 2021



Makes: One Happy and Healthy Holiday

Ingredients:

Vaccination Mask Hand Soap Hand Sanitizer Outdoors Communication Safe Travels

More Information:

Follow community guidelines from your local health department

Steps:

Get vaccinated. Children and adults age 5 and up should get a COVID-19 vaccine. Some groups of people are eligible for a booster shot. Visit your health department website for more info, or talk with your health provider.

Wear a mask. Wear a cloth or surgical face mask over your mouth and nose when grocery shopping or in other public indoor settings, or when serving food.

Wash your hands before eating or serving food.

Outdoors is safer than indoors—enjoy a picnic or other outdoor activities, weather permitting.

Communicate in advance with guests about your COVID-19 ground rules and the precautions you're taking. Cancel plans if you are sick, and stay away from others.

Safe Travels. If possible, delay travel unless you are fully vaccinated. If you are traveling with unvaccinated family members, such as children who are not yet eligible to be vaccinated, take additional precautions. Avoid crowds, wear a mask, and get tested before and after your trip.

Don't forget about the kids' table!

Vaccination is the best way to protect children from COVID-19, and the CDC recommends that children and adolescents age 5 and older get a COVID-19 vaccine. The COVID-19 vaccine is safe and effective for children. More than 11 million adolescents ages 12–17 have already received the COVID-19 vaccine, and as of November 2, children ages 5–11 are also eligible to get vaccinated.



Who Owns What?



Ownership Guidelines for Your Home's Electrical System

When your home's exterior electrical system is damaged, it's important to understand which components are our responsibility and which are yours.

If you receive overhead electric service, we are responsible for the following components:

- Service Drop The wires running from the utility pole to your home.
- Electric Meter Measures your electricity use in kilowatt-hours.

You own and are responsible for repairing the following:

- Weatherhead and Insulator This is the point where our electric lines connect to your home.
- Service Entrance Cable The wire that extends from your weatherhead to the meter and from the meter to your fuse box or circuit breaker box.
- 5. Meter Base Your meter is mounted in this box.
- Fuse Box or Circuit Breaker Box This is the main service panel that houses your fuses or circuit breakers.
- Household Wiring The interior wiring that distributes electricity through your home.

As a customer, it's also your responsibility to maintain open access to the meter and keep obstructions away from power lines that extend from the utility pole to your home. If trees on your property grow near power lines, don't prune or remove them yourself. Consult with a tree contractor who is qualified to work around electric equipment.
