

Department Updates

Building Department

Electrical Problems?

If you are experiencing electrical problems in your home, make sure to call a **Licensed Electrician** to take a look. A qualified individual assessing the issue, and receiving the necessary Electrical Inspections from the Building Department can help ensure the proper safety of installation or repairs. According to the National Fire Protection Association, between 2010-2014 there were 45,210 reported fires involving electrical malfunctions.

Beekman Lane Update

The Engineering Department would like to advise the public that the Beekman Lane rehabilitation project has commenced and should be completed within in the next 2 weeks, weather permitting. The project included the upgrade of handicap ramps and storm drainage inlets. Traffic delays may be experienced during the time of the paving operation.

Health Department

Rabies Update

The Hillsborough Health Department would like to remind residents that the deadly rabies virus is present in wildlife in New Jersey and it can be passed to cats, dogs, and humans. Most often, rabies is found in raccoons, foxes, bats, skunks, and sometimes groundhogs in New Jersey. A fox in Hillsborough just recently was tested and found to have rabies. It is spread to people or pets usually through bites but can sometimes be passed by scratches and open cut exposure to infective saliva.

Hillsborough will have a free rabies vaccination clinic in January - please be sure to visit the health department website at www.hillsborough-nj.org. Check out the "Animal Alley" Section. Any New Jersey resident may attend any free rabies clinic in New Jersey.

- Do not touch or attempt to move downed lines
- Do not operate generators inside your residence nor your garage; use only outdoors

- If using candles, please ensure they are not placed by any flammable material. Lit candles should remain attended at all times. Please extinguish candles when leaving the room.
- If using space heaters, ensure they are placed in a safe location away from any flammable materials and walls.

Floods and Flash Floods

On average, more people are killed by flooding than by any other single severe weather hazard, including tornadoes, lightning, and hurricanes. Most of these deaths occur at night, when it is more difficult to recognize flood dangers, and when people are trapped in vehicles. Do you and your family know what to do in case of a flood?

Remember:

- **DO NOT** drive onto a flooded roadway.
- **DO NOT** go around barriers.
- **DO NOT** drive through flowing water. If you approach a roadway that is flooded, **TURN AROUND - DON'T DROWN**. It takes just 12 inches of rushing water to carry away a small car, while 2 feet of rushing water can carry away most vehicles. It is **NEVER** safe to drive or walk into flood waters.

Drive with extreme caution if roads are even just wet or it is raining. You can lose control of your vehicle if hydroplaning occurs, which is when a layer of water builds up between your tires and the road, causing there to be no direct contact between your vehicle and the road.

- Be Cautious of the Following:
- Broken or leaking gas lines
- Flooded electrical circuits
- Submerged furnaces or electrical appliances
- Flammable or explosive materials coming from upstream.

Additional Precautions:

- Before floodwaters crest, turn off the main power switch if you think the electrical circuits are going to be underwater. Never Touch The Switch While You Are Wet Or Standing In Water. Do not turn the electrical system back on until it has been inspected by an electrician.
- Know what a river height forecast means for your property especially how far your property is above or below expected flood levels.
- Know where to go in case of flooding. Remember that you must seek higher ground as quickly as possible, on foot if necessary.

Public Works

Saturday, October 27th is Shake Your Mailbox day

Each winter, mailboxes are damaged during winter maintenance operations. In most cases, the snow plow does not actually hit the mailbox, but the force of snow thrown from the roadway is enough to knock down a loose or weakened mailbox. Damage to posts and receptacles can often be prevented by proper routine maintenance. If you can shake your mailbox, it probably needs maintenance.

Take time now (in the fall) to make any repairs needed so your mailbox will be strong enough to survive the winter. Proper maintenance may help to prevent damage that results in delayed mail delivery.

Leaf Program Information

Mail in Ballots

Applications for [mail-in-ballots](#) are available online at <http://www.co.somerset.nj.us/CountyClerkElectionDiv> or at the County Clerk's Office, located in the lobby of the county Administration Building at 20 Grove St., Somerville.



Completed mail-in ballots can be mailed to the Somerset County Election Board, P.O. Box 3000, Somerville, NJ 08876. Ballots also can be dropped off at the Election Board, located next to the County Clerk's Office in the County Administration Building . **Mail-In ballots can be returned in person until the polls close at 8 p.m. on election night.** Ballots that are postmarked by Election Day and received by the Election Board within 48 hours after the polls close also will be accepted.

Important Dates

October 30 - Deadline to apply for a Mail-In Ballot by Mail for General Election (not less than 7 days prior to election) .
