

## Department Updates

### **Building Department**

#### *Winterize Your Home*

The holiday season is coming up fast and now is the time when families begin decorating their homes. The festive lights, although pretty, have some associated risk you should be mindful of. When purchasing holiday lights check the packaging for the UL listing for indoor or outdoor use (please use only as directed) and only purchase extension cords that are UL listed as well. Be careful to not overload power strips or receptacles, this can cause overheating or even a short circuit!

The Building Department is pleased to announce an amnesty program, which will run from now until January 31, 2019. This program will excuse residents and business owners from getting penalized for having open permits, having previous work done without permits, failing to obtain a Certificate of Occupancy, and/or have an expired Temporary Certificate of Occupancy. If you visit the Building Department within this allotted time frame, we will assist you with gaining compliance for your projects. Permit fees will still be applicable but, again, you will not be penalized for noncompliance.

**Business Advocate**

**Engineering**

*Engineering Inspections in the Winter Months*

Due to the immensely wet season, residents should be aware that ditches, streams, detention basins and swales that carry stormwater will take a longer amount of time to dissipate. It is noted with the newer New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection requirements, detention basins with infiltration sand bottoms take much longer time to drain. Residents should be aware of this and understand that detention basins are designed to hold back the run-off to prevent flooding downstream.

**Finance Department**

*Homestead Benefits*

If you sell your home in 2019 and will be eligible for any New Jersey Homestead Benefits paid in 2019, you must contact the State of New Jersey at 609-292-6400 to update your address. You should also notify your attorney prior to your closing to ensure that the rebate that you earned is paid to you.

**Health Department**

*Radon Kits*

The Health Department is distributing free radon test kits to residents on a first come, first served basis. These kits are not intended for residences built after 2002. If you live in a house that was never tested and was built on or before January 1, 2002, these kits will help you to determine your risk and what prevention system, if any, is necessary. One kit per residence will be provided.



*Free Rabies Vaccination Clinic*

The Health Department will provide free rabies vaccinations to cats and dogs of NJ residents in January 2019. Please check back on our website in December.

### *Leaf Program Information*



Hillsborough Township provides both a [Leaf Pick Up](#) and a [Drop Off Program](#), which runs from November 1st through the end of December. The Drop Off program is located at the Auten Road Facility. The purpose of this program is to assist residents with the removal of fallen leaves.

Residents are urged to please have their leaves ready at the edge of the curb line on their own property, and to contain them if they are blowing on their neighbor's property using the methods suggested from the Department of Public works link on the town website. It is now the middle of December and the second rounds of collection are well under way. We will continue to update the town website weekly with the general areas being addressed.
