October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

At the September 28th Township Committee meeting, Mayor Shawn Lipani read a proclamation recognizing October as Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month is an annual campaign to increase awareness of this disease, encourage early detection, and support research to find a cure. While there has been an increase in mammography rates and a decline in deaths, there is more that can be done to spread education and awareness.



Dance for the Cure is a non-profit organization committed to the prevention and cure of breast cancer through the celebration of dance and providing financial assistance to local women who were impacted by breast cancer with donations totaling over \$800,000 since its founding in 1999.

Will's Eagle Scout project consisted of installing new hand sanitizer stations at Hillsborough's outdoor YMCA Children's Day Camp. The project involved cutting wood and PVC board, mixing concrete, and fastening materials so they are at a convenient height for a child. The project took 59.7 hours to complete with the assistance of eight volunteers. The hand sanitizer stations will help reduce exposure to the Covid-19 virus,

minimize indoor handwashing visits, and reinforce clean habits.

By constructing a 16 foot long by six-foot-wide footbridge at Skillman Park, foot traffic will be diverted from the drainage route, decreasing soil erosion. This project took a total of 160.5 hours to complete, with the assistance of 18 people.

Congratulations to Neel for this accomplishment and the best of luck in the future!




