



Building Q: What do you do if you are a property owner with open permits for work being performed on a building that is being sold to a new **Department** owner? A: When the new owner takes over the construction project, they must file a permit application with a signed affidavit. The new application should reflect what work has or has not been done, any changes in the original plans submitted, and contractors information. Upcoming Road Paving Projects The Engineering Department would like to advise the public that Beekman Lane between Amwell Road & Triangle Road will be repaved within the next month. The repaving will include the upgrade of handicap ramps and storm drainage inlets. During construction traffic may be detoured or lanes reduced.

New Center Road paving is currently scheduled for two days, weather permitting: Wednesday into Thursday, October 3rd and 4th for milling, and Thursday into Friday 10/4-10/5 for paving..... night time work both days. It's a small section of roadway, but due to the location there will be a complete road closure and detour set-up. Please keep in mind this is tentative and messaging will be sent out as more information becomes available.

<u>Health Department</u>

September is Emergency Preparedness Month Be Prepared With Health Information and "Keep It With You" The Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends that you carry a "Keep It With You" sheet of voluntary, temporary medical information in case you need the information quickly to attend a clinic and you can't get it from your doctor. It will help as you navigate through shelters, clinics, and support services. You can find the CDC form <u>online</u>, or you can check the one on the health department website under emergency information. The form can be folded up and put into a plastic sandwich bag for safe keeping.

This information is intended to stay with you, so that information taken as you go through a clinic, for example, should be copied or written in the clinic's notes, and you keep your sheet. After the emergency you can show your physician what was done at the clinic.

- An example of some information on the forms is:
- Your physician's name and phone number
- Your pharmacy name, address, phone number
- List of medications you take and any special instructions
- · List of allergies to anything including medications
- Active health problems/diagnoses/conditions including pregnancy
- Whether or not you had a flu vaccine this year, or ever had a flu vaccine
- Allergy to doxy or cipro- two of the most common medications to be given out during a biological emergency
- Immunization record should be stapled to the form

There is a place for clinics to record information on your form as you attend each one. Remember to get a flu shot before the end of October-Be Ready For Winter!

Deer Activity

The onset of the fall season typically results in an increase of motor vehicle crashes involving deer. This is in part due to increased deer activity as a result of hunting season and the breeding season for white tailed deer.

The following tips can help motorists stay safe:

- If you see a deer in or near the road, slow down and pay attention for possible sudden movement. If the deer doesn't move, don't go around it. Wait for the deer to pass and the road is clear.
- Pay attention to "Deer Crossing" signs. Slow down when traveling through areas known to have a high concentration of deer.
- If you are traveling after dark, use high beams when there is no oncoming traffic. High beams will be reflected by the eyes of deer on or near roads. If you see one deer, be on guard: others may be in the area. Deer typically move in family groups at this time of year and cross roads single-file.
- Don't tailgate. Remember: the driver in front of you might have to stop suddenly to avoid hitting a deer.
- Always wear a seatbelt, as required by law. Drive at a safe and sensible speed, considering weather, available lighting, traffic, curves and other road conditions.
- If a collision appears inevitable, do not swerve to avoid impact. The deer may counter-maneuver suddenly. Brake appropriately, but stay in your lane. Collisions are more likely to become fatal when a driver swerves to avoid a deer and instead collides with oncoming traffic or a fixed structure along the road.
- Report any deer-vehicle collision to a local law enforcement agency immediately.
- Obey the state's hands-free device law or, better yet, avoid any distractions by refraining from using cellular devices while driving.

Public Works

The Public Works department continues the mill and fill program throughout the township, which involves minor road repairs.

Storm drains are currently being repaired on Beekman Lane so that the Complete Roads paving project due to take place in October is not delayed.

The department is also preparing for the upcoming leaf collection program along with organizing the winter operations.

This project is a continuation of the ongoing 319(h) Clean Water Act Grant from the NJ Department of Environmental Protection from 2014 that the Rutgers Cooperative Extension has been working on along with Township Staff. Phase I includes a rain garden and installation of a naturalized meadow. These green infrastructure demonstrations are designed to manage stormwater and improve water quality.
