<u>Building</u> Department	<i>Q</i> : What do you do if you are a property owner with open permits for work being performed on a building that is being sold to a new owner?
	A: When the new owner takes over the construction project, they must file a permit application with a signed affidavit. The new application should reflect what work has or has not been done, any changes in the original plans submitted, and contractors information. The original permit would then be superseded by the new application.

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Breast cancer is the most common type of cancer that mainly affects women. Around 1 in 8 women will develop invasive cancer, but the survival rate of breast cancer is 89%. Some common risk factors are if a woman has a late menopause after the age of 55 or an early menstruation period before the age of 12. Also, family history of breast cancer such as in a close relative, or genetic testing revealing the presence of certain breast cancer genes, increases a woman's risk for breast cancer. Lifestyle factors that lead to obesity can also contribute to contracting Breast Cancer.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is an all-hazard, allrisk training program designed to teach you how to protect yourself, your family, your neighbors and community during a disaster situation. CERT training promotes a partnering effort between emergency services and the people in the communities they serve.

The onset of the fall season typically results in an increase of motor vehicle crashes involving deer. This is in part due to increased deer activity as a result of hunting season and the breeding season for white tailed deer.

The following tips can help motorists stay safe:

- If you see a deer in or near the road, slow down and pay attention for possible sudden movement. If the deer doesn't move, don't go around it. Wait for the deer to pass and the road is clear.
- Pay attention to "Deer Crossing" signs. Slow down when traveling through areas known to have a high concentration of deer.
- If you are traveling after dark, use high beams when there is no oncoming traffic. High beams will be reflected by the eyes of deer on or near roads. If you see one deer, be on guard: others may be in the area. Deer typically move in family groups at this time of year and cross roads single-file.
- Don't tailgate. Remember: the driver in front of you might have to stop suddenly to avoid hitting a deer.
- Always wear a seatbelt, as required by law. Drive at a safe and sensible speed, considering weather, available lighting, traffic, curves and other road conditions.
- If a collision appears inevitable, do not swerve to avoid impact. The deer may counter-maneuver suddenly. Brake appropriately, but stay in your lane. Collisions are more likely to become fatal when a driver swerves to avoid a deer and instead collides with oncoming traffic or a fixed structure along the road.
- Report any deer-vehicle collision to a local law enforcement agency immediately.
- Obey the state's hands-free device law or, better yet, avoid any distractions by refraining from using cellular devices while driving.

<u>Sustainable</u> <u>Hillsborough</u>

Work is about to begin on Phase I of the Foxchase Pond Restoration Project. This project is a continuation of the ongoing 319(h) Clean Water Act Grant from the NJ Department of Environmental Protection from 2014 that the Rutgers Cooperative Extension has been working on along with Township Staff. Phase I includes a rain garden and installation of a naturalized meadow. These green infrastructure demonstrations are designed to manage stormwater and improve water quality.
