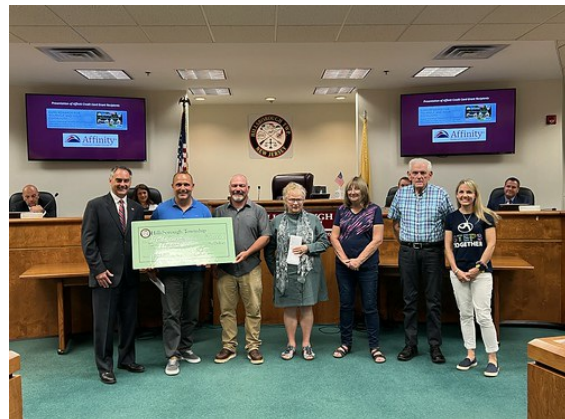

Non-Profits Receive Grant Funds through the Affinity Hillsborough Rewards Visa Credit Card Program

Over \$10K Awarded in Spring 2022 to Non-Profit Organizations Serving Hillsborough's Seniors and Youths

Seven different non-profit organizations received grant awards through the Hillsborough Rewards Visa Credit Card Program at Tuesday's Township Committee Meeting. Representatives from the organizations were present to accept the ceremonial check presented by Mayor Shawn Lipani, the Hillsborough Township Committee, and the members



of the Credit Card Advisory Committee.

The total amount awarded at the June 14th Township Committee Meeting was \$10,089.51. Since the inception of the program, nearly \$90,000 in grants to community-based youth, senior and local non-profit organizations have been awarded. The Spring 2022 Grant recipients are:

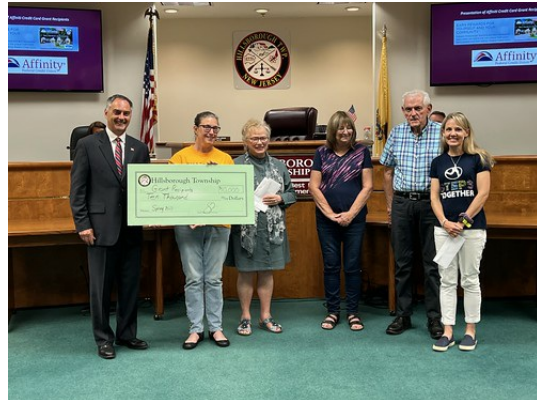

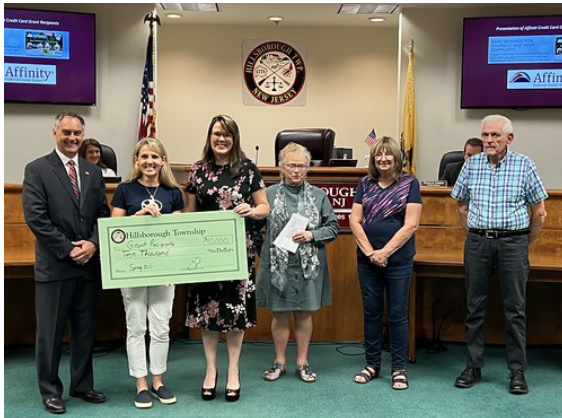

NJ Motor Vehicle Commission Mobile Units Coming Three Times to the 16th Legislative District in the Summer and Fall of 2022

New Jersey's 16th District legislators - Senator Andrew Zwicker, Assemblyman Roy Freiman, and Assemblywoman Sadaf Jaffer - invite you to any one of the upcoming Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) mobile unit events, all running from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. Fulfill a variety of MVC tasks (see below) in a fast and efficient manner. The dates and locations are as follows:

- **Hillsborough at 530 Willow Road: July 27, 2022; October 6, 2022.**
- **Princeton at One Monument Drive: September 26, 2022**

After contacting Ms. Hersh, the resident will be sent a link to a form that will be filled out and submitted. If the event is at capacity, the resident will not be able to register and should try for one of the other upcoming events.

The mobile units will provide the following services:

Driver Licenses: Renew the license, obtain a duplicate license, change name or address on license, add a boat endorsement, add a veteran designation, register to vote and/or make organ donation selections.

Non-Driver Identification Cards: Photo identification that may then serve as a primary or secondary form of personal ID.

Registrations: Renew registration or obtain a duplicate registration card.

REAL ID: For REAL ID, please arrive no later than noon.

License Plates: Surrender license plates.

Placards: Persons with a Disability, Purple Heart, or Disabled Veteran can obtain a placard.

Examination Permits: Apply for an examination permit to take a written knowledge test. The written test itself is not available.

Fireworks Safety

In New Jersey legal fireworks include ground-based sparkling devices and novelties, such as sparklers and smoke devices including smoke balls, candles and cones.

Aerial consumer fireworks — including fireworks, sky rockets, bottle rockets and Roman candles, among others, are prohibited.

If you do use any LEGAL fireworks, please take the following precautions:

- Fireworks must be used away from structures, decks, wooded areas and mulch beds.
- Children may not use legal fireworks.
- Spent fireworks must be wetted or soaked in water before throwing them in the garbage.

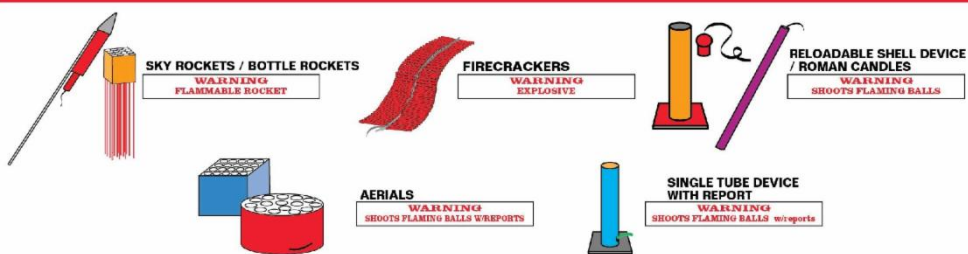

Safe Space

Prepare a safe and cozy hiding place in a room or a crate.

Stay Indoors

Leave your pet with a sitter if you're leaving to join the festivities.

Close doors and windows to muffle loud sounds and remove visual stimulants.

Classical Music

Use soothing music to cancel out the loud bangs coming from firecrackers.

Calming Meds

Ask your vet for any medication to help ease pet anxiety.

Post-Celebration

Clear your home and the yard from any fireworks debris.
